


# **ABOUT US**

### **BRINGING PEOPLE TOGETHER**

In front a full house in Sapporo, Japan in August 2024, IFAR conducted its eighth forum, which was held in conjunction with the 40th Asian Racing Conference (ARC).

With over 200 registered delegates and local dignitaries, IFAR presented a full-day program, including a field visit to Sapporo Racecourse Equestrian Center and a traditional conference featuring expert presentations and discussion.

IFAR has previously conducted conferences in Melbourne, Cape Town, Oslo, Seoul, and Washington D.C. Virtual conferences were conducted in 2021 and 2022.

# MAKING A DIFFERENCE

In 2023, IFAR and the EMHF worked with the World Breeding Federation for Sports Horses (WBFSH), the Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI), and the International Stud Book Committee (ISBC) to have Thoroughbreds competing in equestrian disciplines be recognised in the starting lists and results.


In past Olympics, the retired Thoroughbred racehorses competing were listed only as "breeding unknown."








# **WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT**
